a shameless plug from the music supervisor

There's no other way to say it, working on **Shameless** is a blast. In part it's because the show itself is just so good, but also because it's really unique musically. The music on **Shameless** tries to capture the individual, non-conformist nature of the Gallagher world. Most often the music isn't playing as a piece that a character puts on the stereo to listen to, rather it plays more as score, as the soundtrack to a Gallagher life. That's why the music generally feels kind of messy and rebellious. When John Wells and Mark Mylod first started working on the music, there wasn't any specific plan. We just started playing around with different existing songs and quickly saw that this indie rock vibe really worked for the show. From that point on, it has been an endless quest for great tracks that feel **Shameless**.

It's funny, but working on the music for **Shameless** is a lot like being a Gallagher. There are so many Galllaghers and they never have enough money for what they want, so they have to find some creative way to get it — that's what makes their lives so exciting. On the show, we use so much music, sometimes up to 30 songs in an episode, and we never have enough money for it all. So we have to get creative with the bands we use and really search for unsigned artists or artists that are fans of the show. What's nice is that we often use the same band multiple times and work with the same music companies again and again, creating a sort of music family around the show that's just as fun and crazy as the crowd at The Alibi Room (but smells better).

It was very hard to narrow down the track list for this album. We've used so many great songs throughout the seasons. The tracks we finally decided upon were mostly ones that, upon hearing immediately, conjure the feeling of the show. Be it the wild side with bands like: The Moog, The Wild Yaks, FidLAr, Reverend Peyton's Big Damn Band, or the more heartbreaking side, with tracks like "Years" by JBM and "Hangman" by Chris Pureka. And, of course, we had to include the show's theme song, "The Luck You Got" by The High Strung. It's hard to imagine, but it wasn't the original song we had in the opening sequence. We had another song that we ended up not being able to license, so we kept trying to find something that worked just as well. In the end we got something that was even better. Finally, it was nice to be able to include the opening song from Season Four, "Written Down" by David E. Sugar, especially since it hadn't been released in the US before this. We hope you enjoy this soundtrack as much as we enjoy working on the show!
